


What is Territory Kidney Care?

Territory Kidney Care (TKC) is a new program which allows a specialist team of kidney doctors and nurses to support Congress to better manage your kidney health care.

This is done by sharing information about you and your kidney health story from your medical record.








Why is working with TKC important?

If you are at risk of developing chronic kidney disease, TKC will pick this up. This allows for earlier education and treatment to be given to manage your risk factors.

If you already have sick kidneys, TKC can provide specialist information to your doctor on how to better manage your kidney disease and keep healthy for longer.

Having your information sent to TKC will also help Congress to plan for better kidney services for you and your families within your local community and the NT.



What information will be shared with TKC?

Territory Kidney Care only receives information that is needed to detect if you are “at high risk” of getting chronic kidney disease or, to detect if you already have kidney disease. (For example, no women’s business, mental health or sexual health information will be shared or used.)

Having the right kidney health information helps the kidney specialists to monitor the health of your kidneys. They provide specific information back to your local doctor on how best to treat your kidney disease and prevent (or slow down) you needing to have dialysis.



What do you have to do now?

You don't have to do anything because Congress has agreed to be part of the Territory Kidney Care program if you are at high risk of kidney disease.

Your information will automatically be securely sent to Territory Kidney Care unless you decide to opt out.

We will discuss this with you at your next visit and record your decision if necessary.

If you are worried, please ask your doctor, nurse or Aboriginal health practitioner.
