

## Congress Integrated model for Child and Family Services

	<p><b>Primary Prevention</b> Targets children with no current problems but are at risk of developing problems – identified risk usually based on low SES or maternal education level.</p>		<p><b>Secondary Prevention</b> Targets children with current problems identified early in life when most likely to respond to intervention and before gets worse – determined by screening OR referral to services.</p>	
<p><b>Centre Based</b> Most of work is done at a centre where child and or families come in to access service.</p>	<p><b>Child focussed Abecedarian</b> Immunisations Child Health Check Developmental screening</p>	<p><b>Carer focus</b> Health advice to Parents in clinic (eg nutrition, brushing teeth, toilet training)</p>	<p><b>Child focussed Child centred play therapy Therapeutic day care Preschool Readiness Program</b> Antibiotics</p>	<p><b>Carer focus Filial Therapy</b> Circle of security Parenting advice/programs Parent support groups</p>
